<u>ORDER</u>

Pursuant to §§ 2.2-4020, 54.1-110 and 54.1-2400(11) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended

("Code"), a formal administrative hearing was held before a panel of the Board of Nursing ("Board") on

September 16, 2015, in Henrico County, Virginia, to inquire into evidence that James P. Farrar, Jr., C.N.A.,

may have violated certain laws governing nurse aide practice in Virginia and to inquire into evidence that

Mr. Farrar may have violated certain terms and conditions imposed on him, as set forth in the Order of the

Board entered on May 31, 2013. The case was presented by Wendy Deaner, Adjudication Specialist,

Administrative Proceedings Division. James Rutkowski, Assistant Attorney General, was present as legal

counsel for the Board. Mr. Farrar was not present and was not represented by legal counsel. The proceedings

were recorded by a certified court reporter.

Upon consideration of the evidence presented, the Board adopted the following Findings of Fact and

Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. James P. Farrar, Jr., C.N.A., was issued Certificate No. 1401-154740 to practice as a certified

nurse aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia on August 1, 2012. Mr. Farrar was also issued Registration No.

0031-006325 to practice as a medication aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia on November 14, 2012. Said

certificate and registration were suspended by an Order of the Board, entered May 31, 2013, and the suspension

was stayed contingent upon certain terms and conditions. The stay of suspension was rescinded on June 12,

2015, and this certificate and registration were indefinitely suspended.

2. Based upon the representations of Wendy Deaner, Adjudication Specialist, and

Commonwealth's Exhibit No. 1, the Notice of Formal Hearing and Statement of Particulars, Allegation Summary Worksheet and Affidavit of Mailing, the presiding officer ruled that adequate notice was provided to the respondent and the hearing proceeded in his absence.

- 3. By Board Order entered May 31, 2013, Mr. Farrar's certificate to practice as a certified nurse aide and his registration to practice as a medication aide were indefinitely suspended. The suspension was stayed contingent upon certain terms and conditions, including compliance with the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program ("HPMP".)
- 4. On May 15, 2015, Mr. Farrar was dismissed from the HPMP for noncompliance, including failure to enter into treatment as recommended, continued use of benzodiazepines, and failure to comply with the toxicology screening program.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Board concludes that Finding of Fact No. 4 constitutes a violation of §54.1-3007(6) of the Code and Term No. 5(a) of the Board's Order entered May 31, 2013.

<u>ORDER</u>

WHEREFORE, the Virginia Board of Nursing, effective upon entry of this Order, hereby ORDERS as follows:

- 1. Certificate No. 1401-154740 issued to James P. Farrar, Jr., C.N.A., to practice as a certified nurse aide in the Commonwealth of Virginia is hereby continued on INDEFINITE SUSPENSION.
- 2. The certificate of Mr. Farrar will be recorded as SUSPENDED. Should Mr. Farrar seek reinstatement of his certificate consistent with this Order, he shall be responsible for any fees that may be required for the reinstatement of his certificate prior to issuance of his certificate to resume practice.
- 3. At such time as Mr. Farrar shall petition the Board for reinstatement of his certificate, an administrative proceeding will be convened to determine whether he is able to return to the safe and competent practice as a certified nurse aide.

4. Mr. Farrar is hereby REPRIMANDED.
